A relatively small pub although, slightly extended from the days since its previous incarnation of a McMullen's Pub before half of the building was sold off as a private residence, when we last frequented this neck of the woods. The garden was quite large and well covered by illuminated marquees, probably a hangover from Covid restrictions and, more likely, the recent weekend 'Honesty beer festival' a great event the Hare was aware of.

Anyway they were all empty of customers, leaving ample room for a big Pack of Herts Hashers! Shame only 5 turned up!! [It was mentioned the week before about changing the date to fit in with the Beerfest, for a bit of advertising for the Hash, but it decided it would be too much up heavily as it's like herding cats to change a day when some don't take any notice of all the posts about a 10 minute early start! The witching time came and the GM introduced the run, number 1997 and called the Hare into the circle to give his waffle about the Trail. **TBT OBE** claimed the Trail was relatively short and would only take about 45 mins. Normally this would have been met with jeers as we have all been on **TBT OBE's** Trails before.... need I say more 😊 he added there would be a short cut for the walkers (that was three of us sorted), leaving the two runners, Milf and Ketchup to run the full Trail. There was also a sweetie stop to look forward to. Then the Hare said he would buy the taker of the best Alpaca picture a pint.

So, with mobile-phones at the ready we set out of the pub, turning left past the village pump and green to the first check.
